"School warning as explicit images shared to pupils" BBC News A school has issued a warning to parents about a WhatsApp group in which explicit images are being shared to children. The group, called Add People, reportedly has members as young as nine years old, North Bromsgrove High School and Sixth Form said in a letter seen by the BBC. More than 200 Bromsgrove children were said to have been added to the group and West Mercia Police confirmed it had investigated a report of a safeguarding concern from a person in the town.

The BBC has contacted the school for comment. Parents and guardians were urged by the school to check their children's social media activity as police had found inappropriate videos and pictures were being added to the group. It was reported to police on 1 February, and officers have since visited a number of schools in the area "to make them aware of the group and remind students and parents of the importance of staying safe online", the force said.





All Years Notices: Canteen Exciting News!

The canteen is due to open on Monday, and we plan to have the cashless system up and running too. Thank you to the parents that have already given their permission for their children to use the biometric system, many of the students have already had their thumb prints taken and the Sharp team are returning on Monday to continue the process. We will have a system in school which will allow us to continue signing students up to the biometric system as we go forward but we would like to get the bulk of our students set up by Monday if possible. If you we have not already given your consent for the biometric scanning, you will have received an email regarding this today.

For those where permission has been given, the ability to upload funds to your child's account is now available on SCOPAY. You will be able to this by clicking on 'Balances', then click on 'Cashless Catering' where you will be given the option 'Top Up Balance'. Select your amount, the minimum amount is \pounds 5.00. The amount you add will then move to your basket, click on the basket icon and checkout.

Cash will continue to be taken, alongside the cashless system until the end of the Spring Term. The school will be operating a fully Cashless System, from the 8th April 2024.

From my understanding the system defaults to a maximum spend of £5 per day but this can be reduced on request. There is a one-day grace period set, whereby the student will still be able to get food should their card have run out that day but please be aware, the value will then be deducted from any top up funds added. We appreciate this is a new system, but please can you check your child's balance on a regular basis, in order that they have sufficient funds available to them when needed.

It has been an immense challenge for our Catering Team to have continued to supply food (hot & cold) to our students, while the renovation work has been taking place, but we also appreciate it has been an extremely difficult time for your children, with not having an appropriate space to eat their food during their social times. I would just like to take this opportunity to thank families for the continued support we received throughout this period and for your constant patience and understanding.
