Focus for the start of the year – Punctuality and being in lessons

We always say that we need to 'get the basics right and the rest will follow'. The main focus for the start of this term is punctuality and being in lessons. To help our students, the following changes will be made:

- Bells will indicate the end of lessons and the start of lessons.
- There will be 3 minutes of 'movement time' from one lesson to another (where there is no break or lunch in between)
- Students who arrive after the 3 minute bell will be marked as late on the register.
- Parents/carers will be informed if their child is late to lessons 3 times or more by Small Schools.

The information above will be shared with students tomorrow during Period X but I would be very grateful if families could let their children know tonight in preparation for tomorrow.

As a reminder, tomorrow is Wednesday so the first lesson starts at 8:40am, with school gates shutting at 8:35am.
